


The 3rd International WANA Congress Urmia, Iran 16 – 17 May, 2024

Royan Jihad Academic Research Institute, in line with its international activities, has aimed to increase its relationship with Islamic and neighboring countries, especially the West Asia and North Africa (WANA) region, so that in addition to interacting with the scientific community, it can play a more effective role in the scientific development and growth of students, researchers and experts of this region. The third international WANA congress was held on the 27th to 28th of May 2024 in cooperation with the Royan Jihad Academic Research Institute and the University of Medical Sciences and Health Services of West Azarbaijan Province (Urmia) Urmia City Unity Hall. The theme of this year's WANA congress was



Assisted Reproductive Techniques Outcome (ART Outcome) with the approach of dealing with the latest scientific achievements in the field of infertility treatment at the global level focusing specifically on the countries of the WANA region. This year's WANA congress was organized under the scientific secretaryship of Dr. Ahmed Vosoogh Taghi Dizj (Radiology specialist and vice president of clinical and specialized services at Royan Institute) and executive secretaries of Dr. Hojat Qasimnejad (Ph.D in Reproductive biology and head of the Reproductive Health Research Center of Urmia University of Medical Sciences) and Dr. Elham Amirchaghmaghi (Immunology Specialist and Head of Reproductive Medicine Research Institute of Royan Institute) and was very well represented by students, researchers, clinical specialists and basic sciences, and faculty members.





Opening ceremony

The 3rd WANA International Congress commenced on Thursday, May 28th at 8:00 AM. The day was coincided with the decade of honor of the two lights of Wilayat and Imamate, Hazrat Fatima Masoumeh (PBUH) and Hazrat Ali Ibn Musa Al-Reza (PBUH). The congress was inaugurated with the speeches of the officials. At first, the President of Urmia University of Medical Sciences, Dr. Mohammad Amin Valizad, as the president of the Congress, presented a brief report of the university's major plans, it was followed by speeches by the scientific secretary of the program, Dr. Ahmad Vosoogh sTaghi Dizj,; the President of Academic Jihad, Dr. Seyed Hassan Muslimi Naini; The head of the representative body of the Supreme Leader in the universities of the province, Seyyed Mehdi Qureshi; Political and social deputy of the West Azerbaijan Governorate, Dr. Ebrahimi; and the head of the population and family support faction of the Islamic Council, Dr. Fatemeh Mohammad Beigi, who was among the guests of this congress.



















As this congress can be a place for synergy and meeting of scientific and business activists in medical and biological sciences, as well as an opportunity for the presence of domestic and international knowledge-based companies that have entered the production of consumer equipment for infertility treatment., the opening ceremony featured the presentation of the companies and financial sponsors of the Congress, Behrad Royesh Royan, Bon Yakhteh Royan Technology, Orchid Farmed, Exxon Farmed, and Diyaco Plus Hotel. In the pre-congress exhibition, the companies were given an opportunity to present their products, which were mostly equipment and pharmaceutical products in infertility treatment.











The opening ceremony was ensued by the scientific sessions. the sessions were mainly focused on ART children; the role of surgery in improving IVF outcomes; the role of imaging in ART outcomes; the impact of environmental and lifestyle factors on ART outcomes, optimizing ART outcomes, challenges, management, and options; fertility preservation & oncofertility; and finally, ethical consideration in ART outcomes.

Presentations were all delivered in English, and the presenters included 10 prominent international speakers from Lebanon, Syria, Iraq, Turkey, and Egypt, as well as more than 30 prominent Iranian speakers and experts.

















This year's WANA featured two pre-congress clinical workshops, one basic science workshop, and one scientific seminar which were all held on May 25 and 26. The two clinical workshops were titled "Hysteroscopy" under the scientific supervision of Dr. Mehri Mashaikhi (specialist in obstetrics and gynecology, infertility fellowship and assistant professor of Royan Institute) and "Endometrial examination in infertile women" under the scientific supervision of Dr. Firoozeh Ahmadi (Radiology specialist and assistant professor of Royan Institute) and were held in the form of one-day workshops at Milad Hospital in Urmia. The basic science workshop was titled "In vitro Maturation and Fertilization of Oocyte in Mice" with the scientific secretary of Dr. Azam Dalman (Ph.D. in reproductive biology and an assistant professor of Royan Institute) was held at the Faculty of Medicine of Urmia University of Medical Sciences in two days. The - scientific seminar entitled "Use of complementary medicine in infertility treatment" with the scientific secretary of Dr. Amirhossein Jamshidi (Ph.D. in pharmacognosy and associate professor of Iran University of Medical Sciences) with the participation of more than 130 participants from the scientific programs next to this congress.











Finally, more than a thousand participants participated in the 3rd WANA International Congress, including international medical students from India, Pakistan, Iraq, and Turkey.









The visit of the students, speakers, and guests from the beautiful tourist areas of Silvana (the suburbs of Urmia) and Urmia Lake was one of the tourist programs of the WANA Congress.





At the end of the second day of the congress, the closing ceremony began with the special blessings of the 8th Imam and the blessing of the Holy Shrine of Razavi to the participants. Then the executive report of the congress was presented by its executive secretaries and thanks were given to the efforts of the executive colleagues, especially the vice of Royan Institute, Dr. Ruhollah Fathi. Next, the executive clip of the congress was shown. In the end, the vice president of research and technology of Urmia University of Medical Sciences, Dr. Saber Qolizadeh, and the head of Royan Institute, Dr. Abdul Hossein Shahvardi, gave a speech and thanked all the participants, domestic and international lecturers, scientific and executive secretaries of the congress and workshops.
